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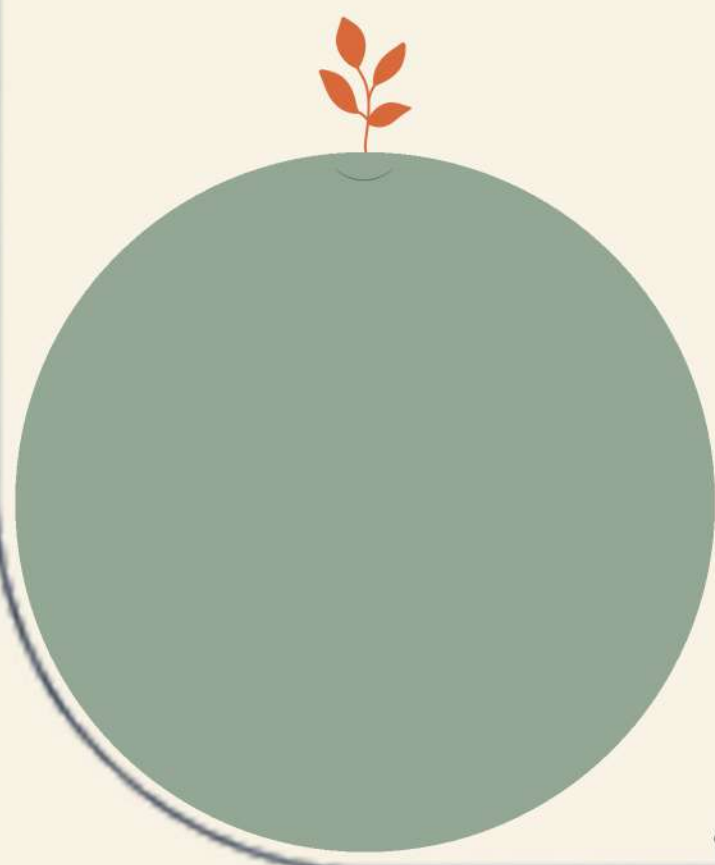

01 — Historic Agricultural Estate

Before the 20th Century

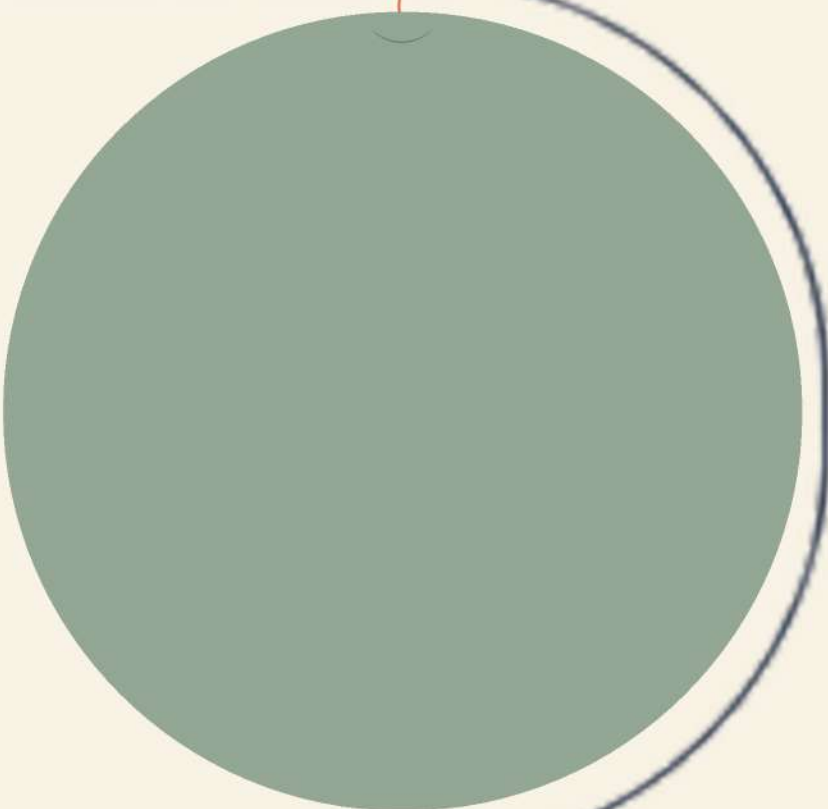
The site developed as a traditional agricultural estate centred around the historic **Alquería**, which served as both the residential and productive heart of the property. The surrounding landscape consisted of cultivated fields, orchards, and irrigation channels, forming a self-sustaining rural environment where agriculture defined both the architecture and the landscape.



02 — Expansion of Agricultural Production

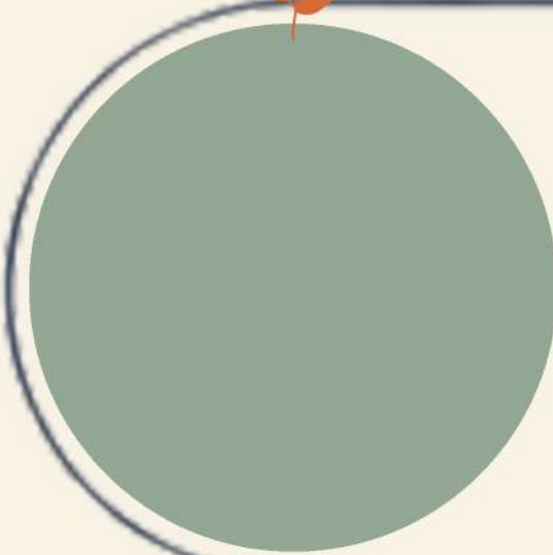
Early 20th Century

As agricultural production increased, additional agricultural service buildings were introduced to support farming activities. The cultivated fields expanded and the orchard became more organized, while the historic Alquería continued to function as the main operational centre of the estate.



03 — Agricultural Modernization

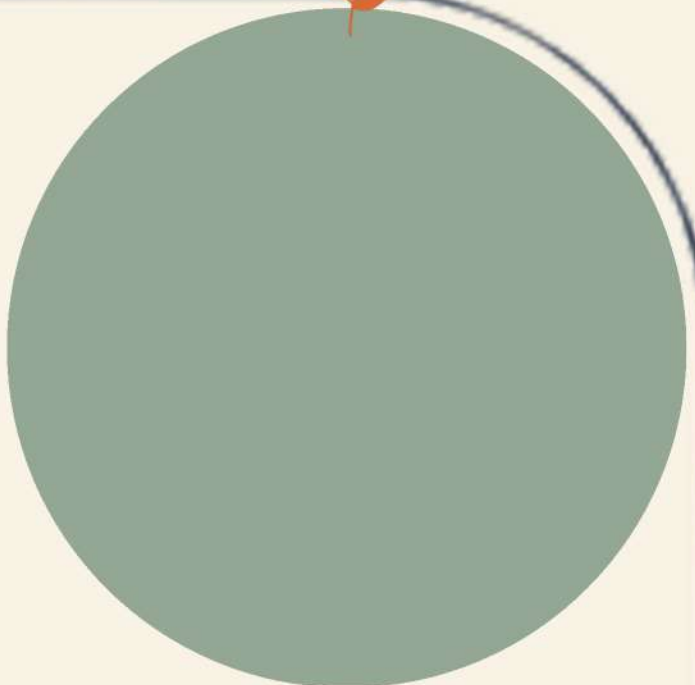
The introduction of the **Motor Well** marked a significant technological shift in the site's development. Groundwater pumping supplemented the traditional irrigation network, improving water availability and allowing more efficient crop production while maintaining the site's agricultural character.



04 — Industrial Agricultural Development

Mid 20th Century

With the modernization of farming practices, **20th Industrial Warehouses and Contemporary Agricultural Buildings** were constructed to accommodate machinery, equipment, and agricultural storage. The site gradually evolved from a purely cultivated landscape into a more organized productive complex.

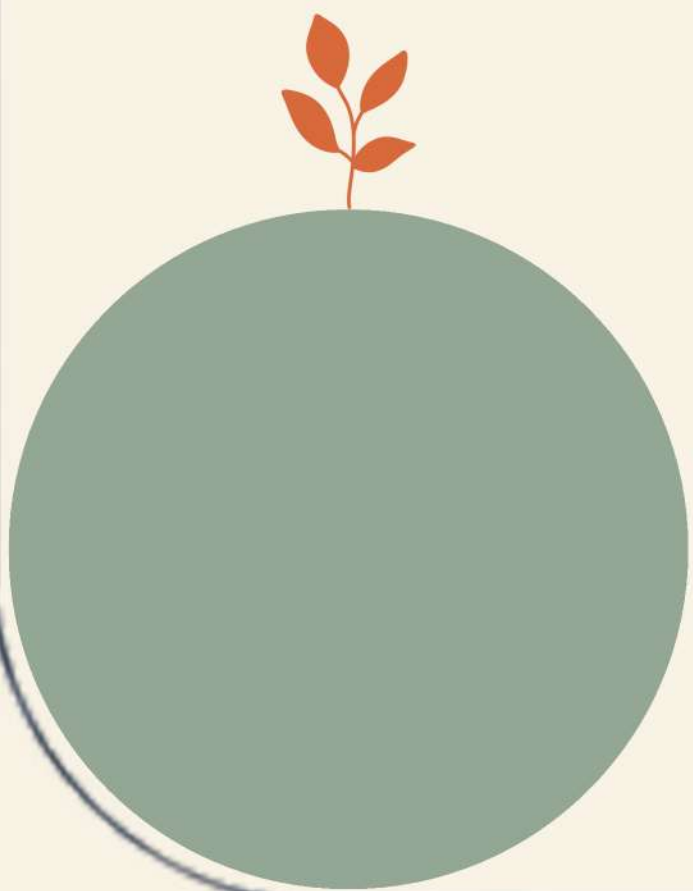

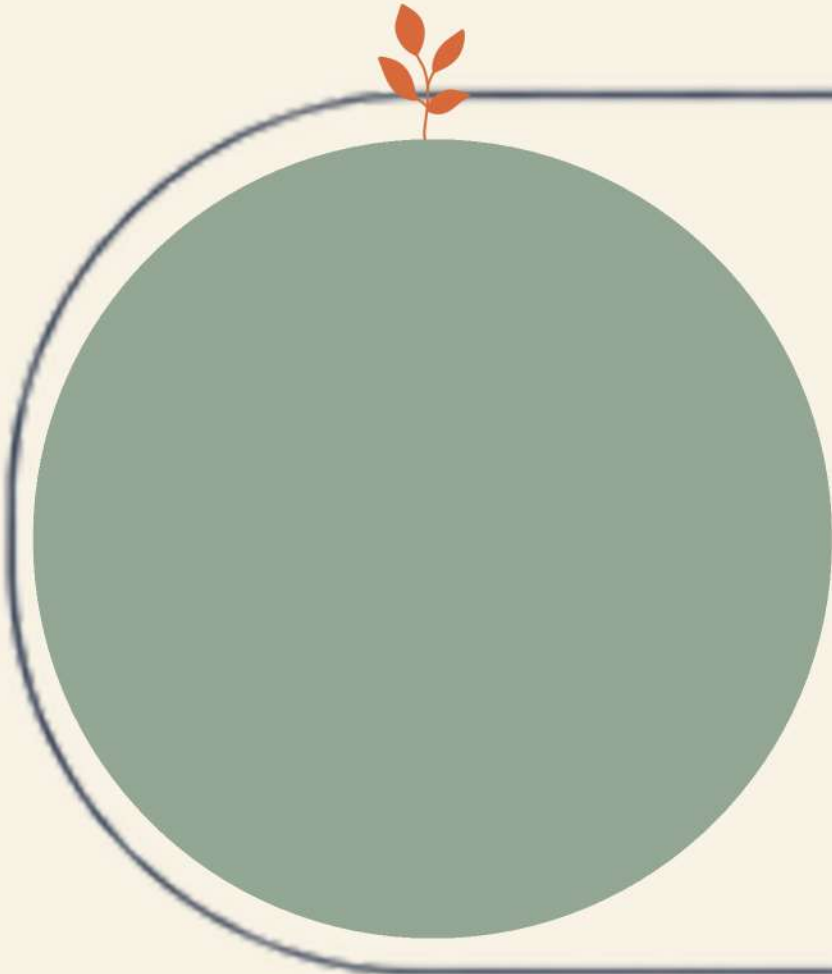
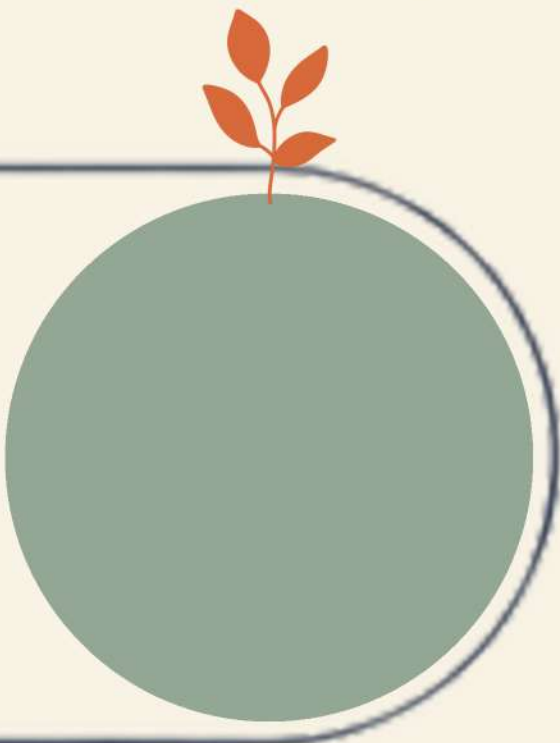


05 — Expansion of Operational Spaces

As agricultural activities became increasingly mechanized, larger service yards and internal circulation routes were developed around the productive buildings. Open working areas replaced portions of cultivated land, providing space for machinery, loading, maintenance, and agricultural operations while preserving the historic built fabric.

06 — Diversification of the Productive Landscape

Agricultural production diversified through the coexistence of cultivated fields, orchards, storage facilities, machinery yards, and contemporary agricultural buildings. Rather than relying solely on crop cultivation, the site began supporting multiple stages of agricultural production, storage, and distribution.

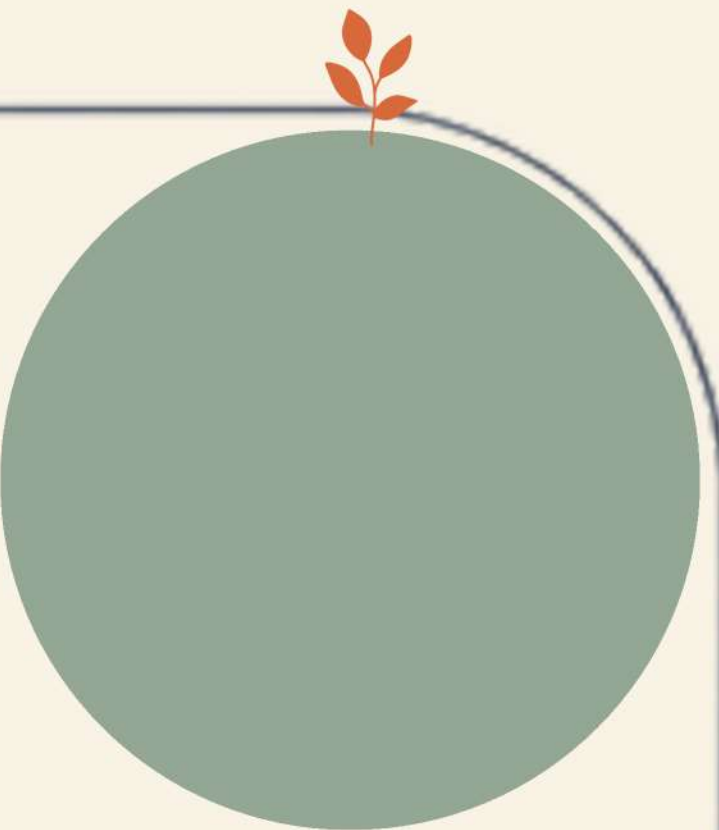


07 — Contemporary Agricultural Complex

By the early 21st century, the site had evolved into a hybrid productive landscape where traditional agricultural heritage coexisted with modern farming infrastructure. The Historic Alquería, 20th Industrial Warehouse, Contemporary Buildings, and Motor Well collectively reflected the site's continuous adaptation to changing agricultural practices.

08 — Present-Day Productive Landscape

Today, the site represents a multifunctional agricultural landscape that balances heritage conservation with contemporary production. Historic structures remain as cultural landmarks, while active fields, orchards, machinery yards, service areas, and agricultural buildings continue to support the site's productive role within the Huerta of Valencia.

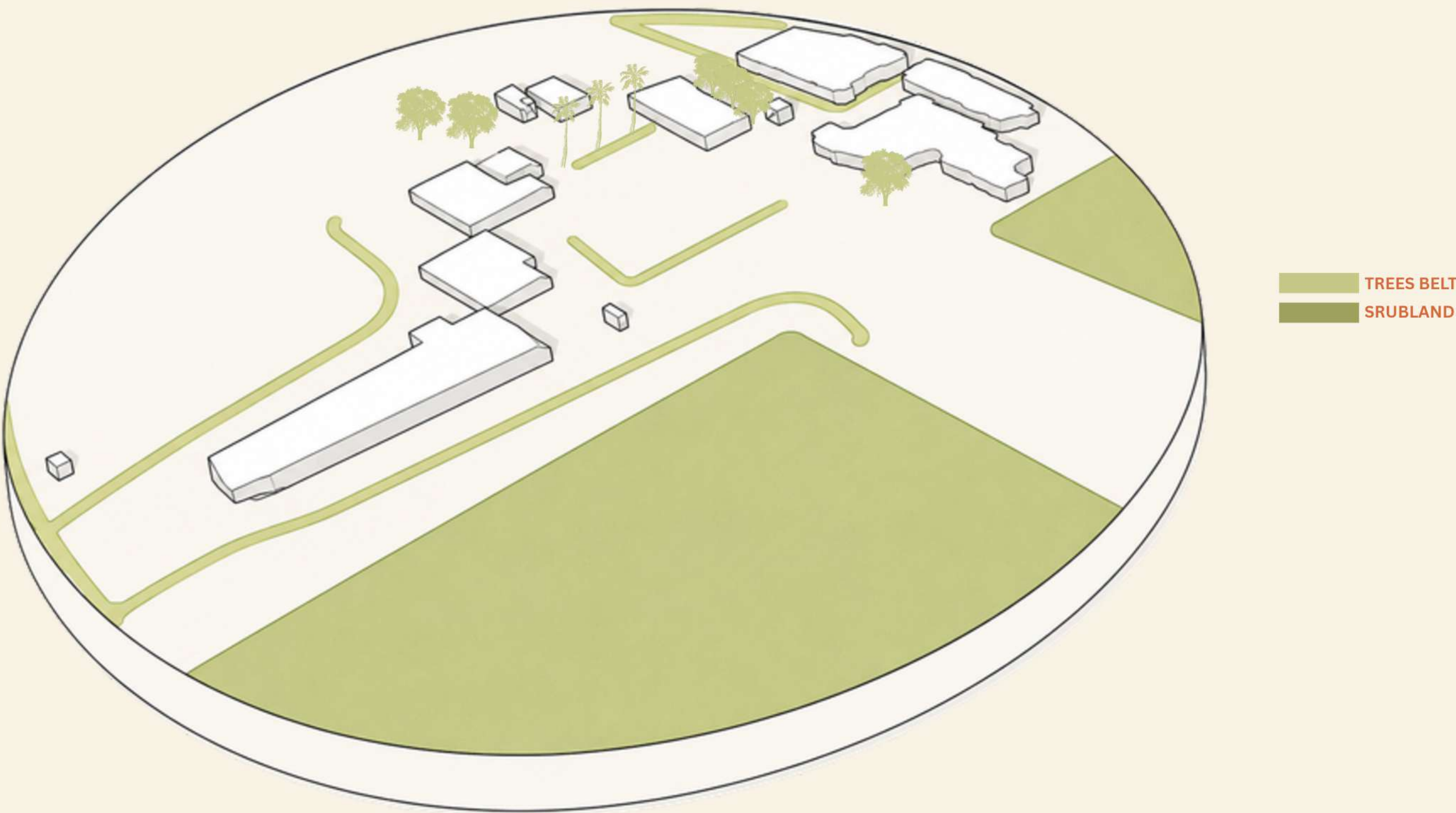

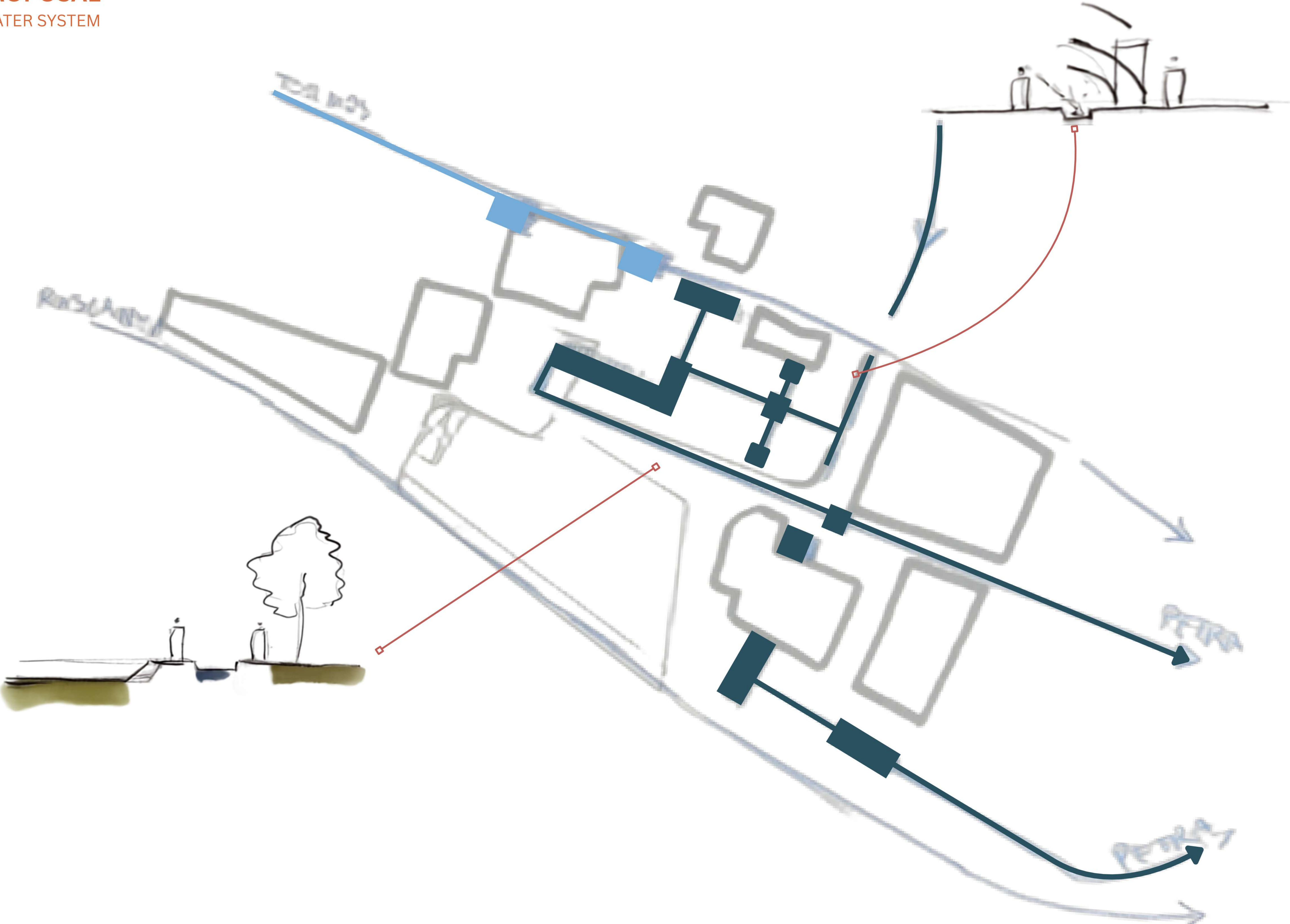

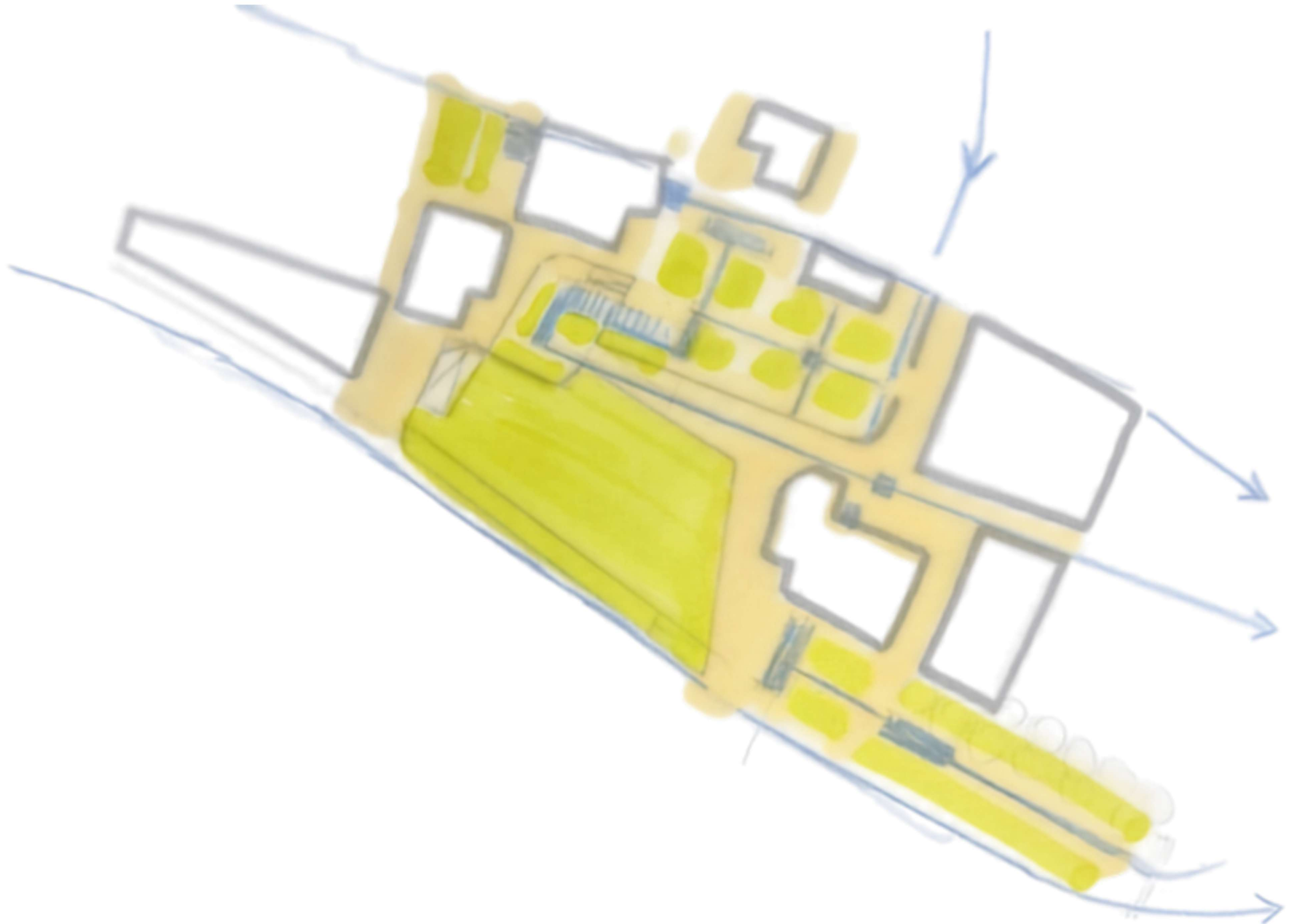
